





How to use PowerPoint? The real question is "How do you want to use PowerPoint?" The business community and teachers want to show visual "titles" to their verbal presentations as "bullet points" or charts and grafs of their subject. Without their verbal presentation the ppt file is useless. PowerPoint could also show a photo album or photo essay, with or without verbal accompaniment. Then, there's me...

Talkin' T-TRAK is a multi format presentation. It starts with the live ppt presentation on ZoomTRAK where the text IS my script for my verbal support. Subsequently it becomes a visual presentation on YouTube, again with my verbal support. Without the audible the ppt file could still be viewed and read by the viewer at their own pace by pausing the video or rewinding as required. But, when converted to Adobe Acrobat pdf files (most of us have Adobe Acrobat and access pdf files from many sources. Not everyone has PowerPoint) TALKIN' is also a print medium presentation without the audible portion. The pdf files can be downloaded or printed and viewed or read as desired and archived. My presentations are like the pages of a book, which they become. So . . .


...and focus on the graphic or photo as I ramble on reading my script. As I proceed with the verbal part of my presentation the audience can view the slide to see what I'm saying.

Open the TALKIN' T-TRAK file of choice. Select "Fit to page" and "Landscape" orientation on your printer and print out full page pages of the slides you can study and disect all you want and save for future reference at any time.

Unfortunately some of my presentations are too long or complicated to be properly presented in the 10 to 20 minutes I'm allowed in a ZoomTRAK production. In those cases the pdf files are the best way to fully explore and view the TALKIN' presentations. In such circumstances I advise the ZoomTRAK audience at the time.
